



The basic requirement for admission to the PhD programme is that a student should have performed well in the Faculty's MPhil in Economic Research programme, or in an equivalent master's programme elsewhere.

Students already studying for the MPhil in Economic Research degree at Cambridge may apply to continue to the PhD, dependent on them achieving a specified standard in the MPhil examinations.

Applications for direct entry to the PhD from candidates with a high-quality master's degree in economics from other universities are also welcomed. If an applicant's previous training is not considered sufficient for direct entry, a PhD candidate may be considered for admission to the MPhil in Economic Research degree. Applicants whose master's qualification is not from Cambridge must submit precise details of their master's training with their application, including the topics covered and the main required reading.

Continuing

Students continuing to the Certificate of Postgraduate Study (the first year of the PhD programme) are required to obtain an average mark of at least 70 from the MPhil in Economic Research.

Students from either the MPhil in Economics, or the MPhil in Finance & Economics need to perform at a very high level, and have a willing supervisor. These students would then need to take some core modules from the MPhil in Economic Research in the CPGS year.







Graduate Admissions Office, on behalf of the Board of Graduate Studies	Co-ordinates the admission process, and makes the official offer of admission.	
Department/Faculty	Makes the initial academic decision recommending admission.	
Degree Committee	Approves the department's admission decision and makes a recommendation to the Graduate Admissions Office.	
College	Will consider students who have received an official offer of admission. All graduate students must be a member of a College.
